Many new LNCs feel lost in the beginning, not because they lack ability, but because their map is unclear.

When experienced LNCs introduce themselves in a group, they lead with their LNC identity:

- “I’ve been an Independent LNC for six years.”
- “I work in a firm that specializes in long term care litigation.”
- “I’m an expert in renal dialysis cases.”

New LNCs introduce themselves completely differently. They talk about their clinical identity - medical surgical, critical care, mother-baby couplet care, and so on.

It’s not that new LNCs are confused about the work. Their questions come from the only professional world they’ve ever known: bedside nursing. They’re transitioning from the RN role they’ve mastered to the LNC role, which feels aspirational.

As nurses, they’re confident in their skills, which are validated by patient outcomes. When they step into legal nurse consulting, that certainty disappears. Suddenly, they’re trying to prove themselves in an unfamiliar world, eager to get clients, but quietly wondering if they can do the work.

And that matters. When you’re brand new to a specialty, you don’t know the norms, the vocabulary, or the expectations yet. You don’t know what’s “basic,” what’s “advanced,” or what questions have been answered a hundred times before. You’re simply asking for help the best way you know how.

That’s not a flaw. That’s the beginning of competence. Experienced LNCs sometimes forget how unfamiliar this field is to nurses who are just discovering it. The learning curve isn’t about intelligence. It’s about exposure. Until someone shows you the landscape, you don’t know where the landmarks are. This is why clarity matters. This is why patience matters. This is why mentorship or self-discovery matters.

When we make the profession easier to understand, new LNCs gain confidence faster. They ask better questions. They make better decisions. And the entire field benefits from a stronger, better prepared next generation.

Everyone starts somewhere. Our job as more experienced LNCs is to make “somewhere” a little easier to navigate.
