## REMOTE POSITIONS

If you're a new LNC searching for a *remote* position, you've probably noticed something frustrating:

You're applying everywhere...

You're willing to help lighten someone's workload...

You're eager to learn...

And yet — nothing.

Here's the truth many new LNCs don't hear:

### **Remote LNC jobs are rare, and the competition is intense.**

Most new consultants feel stuck because:

- LNC jobs are limited
- Remote roles are even rarer
- Part-time roles are almost nonexistent
- LinkedIn postings get hundreds of applicants within hours
- You don't know where else to look

And most people are searching the same keywords:

- "remote LNC jobs"
- "part-time LNC jobs"
- "how to get my first LNC job"
- "where do I find LNC positions?"

Here are additional keywords that often surface LNC-adjacent roles:

- Clinical Analyst
- Clinical Reviewer
- Quality Reviewer
- Chart Auditor
- Medical Analyst
- Medical Review Nurse
- Nurse Abstractor
- Clinical Documentation Specialist
- Nurse Paralegal

But here's the part most new LNCs don't realize:

## **Many LNC jobs never make it to LinkedIn at all.**

They're posted on:

- company career pages
- internal referral systems
- private recruiter lists
- malpractice carriers
- plaintiff and defense firms
- utilization review companies
- case management companies
- IME vendors
- expert witness firms
- healthcare consulting firms

So how do you improve your chances?

## **PRACTICAL STEPS THAT ACTUALLY HELP**

### **1. Set up alerts everywhere — with narrow filters**

Use Google Alerts, Indeed, CareerBuilder, Facebook, and LinkedIn. Choose "as-it-happens" so you're notified immediately.

### **2. Tailor your resume every single time**

A generic resume blends into the pile.  
A tailored resume shows you understand the role.  
Use keywords from the job description and highlight analytical skills.

### **3. Build a small portfolio of sample work product**

Almost no new LNCs do this — which is why it stands out.  
Include:

- a de-identified sample report
- a writing sample

- a brief case summary
- a short explanation of your process

It shows you understand duty, breach, causation, and damages — even without prior cases.

#### 4. Build relationships with recruiters who place LNCs

A handful specialize in:

- quality
- case review
- chart audit
- utilization review
- law firm placements

They often know about openings before they're posted.

#### 5. Apply fast — ideally within 4 to 24 hours

Speed matters.

Applicants who apply within one day are significantly more likely to get interviews.

### THE BOTTOM LINE

Remote LNC jobs *do* exist — but they're limited, competitive, and often hidden. You can't control the job market, but you *can* control your strategy.

And the LNCs who get hired aren't always the most experienced... They're the ones who are prepared, visible, and ready when the opportunity appears.
